## WOOD FURNITURE AND ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS

Wood is a natural material that expands and contracts in response to changes in temperature and humidity. To maintain the structural integrity and appearance of your furniture, it must be kept in a climate-controlled environment with a consistent relative humidity level between 35% and 55%, and a stable room temperature between 60°F and 80°F.

Failure to maintain proper environmental conditions may result in cracking, warping, splitting, joint separation, finish damage, or other issues related to wood movement. These conditions are not considered manufacturing defects and are not covered under warranty.

It is the responsibility of the owner to ensure that furniture is stored and used in an environment with appropriate humidity control, including the use of humidifiers, dehumidifiers, or HVAC systems when necessary.
